
2 – The Team


- Olivier Peyronel, guide and botanist en the Natural Reserve of Ardeche Canyon,

- Jean-Yves Bigot, rather specialized in caves and karst.




3 – Lay-Over In Prague




The next picture, taken near Bachar Palace, will be too much...




The portraits of potent Syrian men often are exposed on the sides of the main roads and official

The Caspian Turtles are carnivorous and feed little aquatic invertebrates, insects, amphibians... and of course carcass.


14 – Krak Des Chevaliers




The Krak des Chevaliers is a great castle but will not resist a very longtime against Muslim army...

The name of Krak come from Syriac language « Kerak » means fortress.






16 – Krak Des Chevaliers des Chevaliers 15-10-2010 No guardrail, but a very good wonderland.










Exceptionally, we bought some food in Latakia. We arrived and we ate in Quismeen in Geological Museum.



22 — Oil Indications

The first site of this morning is located in the forest massif of Baër in the north of Latakia.



The geological unit, called Baër-Bassit and mainly composed of ophiolites, thrusts by obduction the sedimentary deposits. This site allows to see basaltic intrusions contaminated by the oil rising to the surface. In the jargon when it smelts « oil indication » : often a good indicator for oil workers.

23 – Stopping In Slunfah






We decide to eat on the road a few local specialties.



30 – Messinian Canyons








Of course, the Nahr al Kabir river isn't a wide river, we can cross it without to get wet shoes.... Almost...

The American embargo has forced Syrian people to make a new terraces (using bulldozers), extending the areas cultivated on the wooded slopes of the coastal range.








The mosque of Malek is located on the crests of Coastal Mountain Range.
They dominate the Ghab Plain.

















But only if you have marked (GPS) some points as expansion joints opened yet or piles of rubbish...













In addition, this site is grandiose and occurs an archeological interest...

48 – Malek Megadoline

The enormous closed depression (megadoline) of Malek is located on the top of Coastal Mountain Range. In the bottom of this megadoline, appear the altered basalt. In the sixties, Russian geologists has believed see a volcanic chimney... We will propose an hypothesis more geological than Russian gays.

The fault contact between basalt and limestone is proved by striates. Actually, the position of basalt is the result of faulted contact do not as magmatic chimney. According Jean-Yves « *la messe est dite* » ("the mass is told » means it's clear), the interpretation of Russian geologists is a *geopoetic* view, in no case geological.








57 – Bedouins



Bedouin people lives yet in the countryside or suburbs. Their way of life is ancestral but settled people respects it.






59 – Bedouins

Slunfah is a summering on mountain where grows a peculiar specie of oaks.


The Bedouins live mainly on livestock farming.




61 – At Home In Shikh Hossamo

and 3 km from Saladin's Castle.








66 – Garbage Recycling






The great doline of Djoubé (Djoubit Bourgal) occurs a basaltic bottom that is cultivated.



70 – Orontes River

Orontes River originates in Lebanon, crosses the Ghab Plain and Turquey before reaches the Mediterranean Sea. Orontes River has been canalized in the goal to irrigate the Ghab Plain. With its Mediterranean climate, the population of this part of the Syria grows quickly.

Fault mirror on the eastern border.

The Ghab Plain is a graben, sort of collapse trench filled by alluvial deposits brought with Orontes River. The west slope is very steep, whereas eastern slope (*Djebel Zawiyé*) is less marked. But this side occurs faults mirror very smooth visible in quarries.

72 – Apamea


Roman ruins of Apamea, the colonnade corresponds to the main street, the *cardo maximus*, crossing the city defended by surrounding walls of 8 km long.

View on the Djebel Zawiyé, eastern side of Ghab Plain. The villages are mainly located on the slope, the plain (foreground) is reserved to cultivation
















81 – Ugarit


The Ugarit

This is our last evening together, Karim and Fawaz invite us in the *Venus* Restaurant of Latakia.


To morrow morning, Olivier and Jean-Yves will take the bus to Damascus.


Ludovic will stay in the Latakia region until 10th November and go on the geological reconnaissance.
